To train its volunteers the SBF organized over a 100+ workshops in several parts of India to prepare the volunteers to respond during any calamity viz manmade or natural in their areas and across the country.

We are proud to mention that our efforts are powered by a team of over 2250 dedicated volunteers, who have been instrumental in responding to these catastrophic events and making a positive impact in the lives of those affected.

#### SECRETARY'S MESSAGE

Our beloved country, India, faced severe natural and man-made disasters over the past year. These incidents have undoubtedly been a source of concern for all of us. However, it is also a matter of satisfaction and pride that Society for Bright Future (SBF) played a remarkable role in the field of humanitarian service and disaster management during the year 2024.

In 2024, SBF responded promptly to dozens of major natural disasters — including severe floods, fires, and landslides — across various states such as Assam, Uttar Pradesh, Kerala, Gujarat, Delhi, West Bengal, Haryana, and Jharkhand. Through timely action, SBF successfully rescued over 23,807 affected individuals to safe locations. During these crises, emergency relief in the form of food, clothing, and medicines was provided. For rehabilitation,

assistance was extended for repairing homes, and temporary shelters were arranged.

Under Project Rahat, a winter relief initiative focused on blanket distribution, 317 programs were organized in 14 states in 2024. As a result, 18,356 blankets were distributed to poor and needy families to help them through the harsh winter.

We take great pride in stating that all of these accomplishments are the result of the relentless efforts of over 2,250 talented, dedicated, and determined volunteers, who not only faced every challenge with courage but also played a key role in saving and improving thousands of lives.



## **RESPONSE IN FLOOD**

#### **ASSAM FLOOD**

On 02<sup>nd</sup> June 2024, relentless heavy rains led to a dramatic rise in river water levels across Assam, severely disrupting daily life and affecting thousands of residents. In response to the crisis, Society for Bright Future (SBF) volunteers quickly mobilized, reaching over 80 floodaffected villages to provide crucial support and relief.



### FIRE IN DELHI

In 2024, the volunteer team responded to three significant fire incidents in Delhi, providing crucial support to affected communities-

**Bawana:** Conducted large-scale relief distribution on 27<sup>th</sup> Nov 2024 for fire-displaced families, ensuring timely aid through coordinated logistics.

#### FIRE IN BIHAR

In a series of Fire events in Bihar during 2024, SBF volunteers responded quickly and provided necessary support-

- 1. Dooba Village, Araria:- Ration kits distributed for 40 families
- 2. Katihar city, Bihar: -90 sarees distributed for female victims
- 3. Patna, Bihar: took part in rescuing 60 families
- 4. Ahmedabad block, Katihar: Ration kits distributed 275 and new clothes distributed to 50 families
- 5. Jamta Village, Araria: Ration kits distributed to 40 families









On 20<sup>th</sup> December 2024, a massive fire broke out in parts of Haryana, causing extensive damage and displacing numerous families. SBF volunteers responded by delivering emergency relief, including the distribution of 125 ration kits, along with food supplies and temporary shelter to those affected.





#### **UTTAR PRADESH FIRE**

On 16<sup>th</sup> September 2024, massive blast occurred in a warehouse in Naufira village, Shikohabad area of Firozabad district. Volunteers actively engaged in relief efforts, providing support and medical assistance to those affected.



On 17<sup>th</sup> June 2024, a tragic train accident near Siliguri, West Bengal, involving the Kanchanjunga Express, claimed nine lives and left over 30 injured. SBF volunteers quickly responded, reaching the site and coordinating closely with the nodal officer to assist in rescue and relief efforts.

A team of volunteers from the Society for Bright Future (SBF) in Hazaribagh visited the site of a train accident in Chakradharpur, Jharkhand. The accident occurred on the morning of 30<sup>th</sup> July, when several coaches of the Howrah-CSMT Express derailed. Led by Mr. Ayatullah Irfan, Co-Convener of SBF Jharkhand, the team visited the site, met with government officials, and provided support to victims in hospitals.







#### RESPONSE TO STORM IN NEW JALPAIGURI, WEST BENGAL

On 31st March 2024, a severe storm struck New Jalpaiguri, West Bengal, causing significant damage. The volunteer's team of West Bengal quickly mobilized and launched a comprehensive relief effort to assist those affected by the disaster.

## TREE FOR LIFE - A NATIONWIDE SAPLING PLANTATION INITIATIVE

In 2024, the SBF expanded its "Tree for Life" campaign to promote environmental sustainability and disaster resilience, the initiative saw plantation drives in 33 locations across seven states—Assam, Bihar, West Bengal, Uttar Pradesh, Jharkhand, Rajasthan, and Chhattisgarh. Over 215 volunteers planted 2,886+ saplings, many sourced from local government nurseries.





#### **BLOOD DONATION DRIVES AND CAMPS**




#### TRAFFIC RULES AWARENESS PROGRAM



#### STATE CONVENERS TRAINING & ANNUAL WORKSHOP

The State Conveners Training Workshop and Annual Review Meeting is a vital organizational event aimed at empowering state-level leaders with the skills, strategies, and clarity needed to effectively coordinate activities and drive impact across regions. Organized by the Society for Bright Future (SBF) or a similar organization, the program serves a dual purpose: training for future action and reviewing past progress.





#### ANNUAL GENERAL BODY AND ANNUAL GOVERNING BODY MEETING

On 23<sup>rd</sup> July 2024, SBF organized the Annual General and Governing Body Meeting, A key event in the organizational calendar that brings together the core leadership, board members, to review progress, ensure accountability, and set the strategic direction for the upcoming year. This meeting is essential for maintaining transparency, strengthening governance, and fostering a shared understanding of the organization's mission, achievements.



## MITIGATION PROGRAMS AND VOLUNTEERS ENGAGEMENT

On 12<sup>th</sup> August 2024, SBF conducted extensive mitigation drives across 8 zones in 7 states, focusing on training, collaboration, and expanding outreach. The initiative included coordination meetings, volunteer workshops, and field visits led by senior conveners. Notable engagements took place in Uttar Pardesh East with 9 area cores, across 7 districts, Bihar with meetings in Araria and Patna, Jharkhand with 5 area core in 4 districts, Rajasthan with a one-day volunteer workshop involving 7 area teams, and a strategic planning session with area conveners in Delhi.


#### **GET-TOGETHER WITH DIRECTOR, VISION 2026**



#### MEETING WITH DEPUTY DIRECTOR GENERAL, NCC


