## Relief and Rehabilitation

### Flood Relief, Punjab

The Society for Bright Future (SBF) actively responded to the devastating floods in Punjab, providing critical relief and support to affected communities. Relief activities covered 16 villages across 5 districts, distributing essential supplies including water bottles, ready-to-eat foods, and potassium permanganate. Medical assistance reached families and livestock, benefiting 1,500 recipients. SBF's HQ delegation conducted ground-level surveys, boat assessments, and community meetings, forming the Punjab Flood Relief Committee with local partners to coordinate aid. Immediate consolation support was provided to bereaved families. Rehabilitation surveys are conducted Pathankot, ensuring continued assistance for long-term recovery. SBF remains committed to restoring hope and resilience in flood-affected communities.

## FLOOD RELIEF, RAJASTHAN

Heavy flood have severely impacted parts of Sawai Madhopur district in Rajasthan, leaving many families struggling for basic needs. The SBF, in collaboration with partner organizations, immediately launched round-the-clock relief and rescue operations to support the affected communities.

Under the leadership of State Convener Waseem Akram and dedicated volunteers including Mohd. Abrar, Waseem Shah, and others, the team has been working tirelessly in Surwal, Dhanauli, and Jadawata villages. Their efforts have so far resulted in the distribution of 576 dry ration kits.

During the field visit, the team also engaged with victims, assessed damages, and assured families that they are not alone in this difficult time. Media representatives like Hashim Khan (Khabar Rajasthan) and community leaders such as Abul Kalam also stood in solidarity.



## FLOOD RELIEF, DELHI

On 11th September 2025, SBF distributed 100 Hygiene Kits to flood-affected families in Madanpur Khadar, Delhi. Led by Mr. Abul Sattar and Ms. Huma, and coordinated by Mr. Shahzad, the drive received valuable support from Ms. Gudia.



## WALL COLLAPSED, DELHI

On 9th August 2025, a wall collapse in Jaitpur, Delhi prompted an immediate response from the SBF Team led by Mr. Abdul Sattar. In coordination with DDMA and local authorities, volunteers assisted in rescue efforts, ensured safety, and extended relief to affected families with compassion and dedication.





## **BUILDING COLLAPSED DELHI**

On 20 August 2025 The SBF Team - Delhi, led by National Coordinator Mr. Irfan Ahmad, promptly reached the site of the building collapse at Sadbhavna Park. The team actively assisted in the ongoing rescue efforts alongside NDRF and SDRF personnel.



During the operation, Mr. Irfan engaged in on-ground discussions with the NDRF Inspector to assess the situation and extend organizational support. Volunteers Mr. Amaan, Mr. Rizak, and Mr. Hamza were the part of team, contributing to relief activities with diligence and commitment.

## **FLOOD RELIEF, JHARKHAND**

On 22 August 2025, Severe floods have devastated Balbal Village, burying homes and creating rising health risks. The SBF Team - Jharkhand conducted a ground assessment and assured urgent medical and sanitation support, prioritizing children and the elderly. SBF remains committed to restoring safety, dignity, and hope for affected families.

# TRAINING AND WORKSHOPS



## NATIONAL STATE CONVENORS TRAINING WORKSHOP 2025 – NEW DELHI

The SBF Headquarter successfully organized its National State Convenors Training Workshop on 12–13 July 2025 in New Delhi, The workshop served as a platform for leadership development, teamwork enhancement, and experience sharing, aligning with SBF’s mission to build a compassionate and disaster-resilient volunteer network.



Throughout the sessions, speakers emphasized the spiritual essence of social service, the importance of ethical fundraising, and the power of unity in volunteerism. Inspiring changemakers and guest speakers shared practical insights on social responsibility, environmental protection, and community safety, motivating participants to strengthen grassroots initiatives in their respective regions.



The workshop concluded with an Award Ceremony, honouring outstanding contributions and reaffirming the organization’s commitment to its vision of “Bringing Help and Hope” to communities across India through dedication, compassion, and collective action.

## TRAINING WORKSHOP ON DISASTER REDUCTION & RESILIENCE

On 27th August 2025, the SBF organized a Training Workshop on Disaster Reduction and Resilience at Karhal, Mainpuri, Uttar Pradesh. The program began with Opening Words by Mr. Iltimas Ahmad and a welcome from Mr. Qasim Jaan. Dr. Amir Jamal presented the training objectives, followed by sessions on calamities, disaster management, and First Aid/CPR by Mr. Suresh Kumar (Civil Defence, Delhi). Mr. Irfan Ahmad delivered sessions on mental health, team building, and volunteer roles. The Karhal Fire Station Team conducted firefighting training. The workshop concluded with Closing Remarks by Mr. Irfan Ahmad, enhancing volunteer preparedness and resilience.



## WOMEN'S TRAINING WORKSHOP ON DISASTER MANAGEMENT

On 7th September 2025, the SBF Team, Delhi successfully organized a Women's Training Workshop on Disaster Management at The Scholar School, Delhi, aimed at empowering women with disaster awareness and preparedness skills. The program featured guidance and coordination by Ms. Qamar Jahan, Ms. Sharda, Ms. Saeeda Rashmi, and Ms. Unaiza Khan, who actively contributed to participant engagement and facilitation.

Sessions were conducted by Mr. Irfan Ahmad (National Coordinator, SBF) on mental health during crises, Dr. Amir Jamal (Volunteer Coordinator, SBF) on disaster preparedness objectives, and Misses Sadia with an inspiring address. Mr. Suresh Kumar (Civil Defence, Delhi) led practical demonstrations on first aid and emergency response techniques.



# PUBLIC UTILITY PROGRAMMES

## TREE PLANTATION DRIVES

The SBF conducted extensive tree plantation drives across 6 states in July and August 2025, planting over 1,000 saplings. Key initiatives included Jabalpur, Darrang (Educare Academy, Dalgaon- Syampur), Radhana, Kithaur-Meerut, Budhana (300+ saplings along roads, schools, and community spaces), Bagpat (200+ trees near Yamuna Ghat), Malerkotla (Ali Masjid Nabha Road), and Dhubri (Motirchar Road). Volunteers, school staff, and local communities actively participated, planting diverse trees like neem, arjun, guava, jamun, bamboo, and Gul mohar. These drives reflect SBF's commitment to environmental awareness, sustainability, and greener communities nationwide. special thanks to volunteers who were actively play their role.



## DIGITAL DETOX AWARENESS DRIVES

The SBF organized two impactful Digital Detox Awareness Programmes to promote healthy and mindful technology habits among students and parents. The first session, held on 3rd August 2025 at Borhichowka, Darrang, featured expert insights from Dr. Azimuddin Ahmed (MO, Patharighat PHC), Matiur Rahman (DDRF, DDMA Darrang), and Hanif Ali (Asst. Zonal Convener, SBF).

The second session, conducted on 6th August 2025 at Educare Academy, Dalgaon Syampur, was led by Principal Mozammel Hoque and the SBF team. Both programmes emphasized the importance of balanced digital habits for better focus, mental health, and overall well-being.


